Ann Berryhill Witte is currently a suspended member of the Washington State Bar Association (WSBA). On September 19, 2018, the Supreme Court of the State of Oregon entered an Order suspending Ann Berryhill Witte from the practice of law in Oregon for 30 days, all of which was stayed pending successful completion of a two-year term of probation. Ms. Witte was disciplined for violating Oregon's RPC 1.15-1(a) and RPC 1.15-1(b). The WSBA notified this Court of the suspension on October 11, 2018, and the Clerk stayed this matter pursuant to ELC 9.2(d) until the stay in Oregon expired. On October 5, 2020, the WSBA advised the Court by letter that the Oregon State Bar had closed its file on the case because Ms. Witte had successfully completed the terms of her probation. At that time, the stay was lifted and the Court entered an order pursuant to ELC 9.2(c) directing Ms. Witte to inform this Court why it should not impose the identical discipline in this state. On October 21, 2020, Ms. Witte filed a response. On October 22, 2020, the WSBA filed a reply. The Court reviewed the file in this matter and determined unanimously that the following order should be entered.

IT IS ORDERED:

The Washington State Supreme Court does hereby reciprocate discipline in the State of Washington. Ann Berryhill Witte is suspended from the practice of law for 30 days, effective September 19, 2018, with the entire suspension stayed based on her successful completion of the two-year term of probation in Oregon.
