This matter came before the Court in accordance with the Washington Supreme Court's Rules for Enforcement of Lawyer Conduct ("ELC"). An Order to Show Cause why the imposition of reciprocal discipline should not be imposed was issued by this Court on October 1, 2019. On November 27, 2019, Mr. Cushman filed a Response to the Order and on February 10, 2020, the Office of Disciplinary Counsel of the Washington State Bar Association filed a Reply to Mr. Cushman's Response.

Pursuant to ELC 9.2(c) and ELC 9.2(e), the Court reviewed the pleadings submitted to this Court, the record on which the discipline was based, the Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Recommendations of the Commission on Practice of the Supreme Court of the State of Montana, and the August 20, 2019, and September 18, 2019, Orders of the Supreme Court of the State of Montana imposing disbarment. After review, the Court unanimously finds that Mr. Cushman was afforded the opportunity to be heard in the State of Montana and that the imposition of the same discipline in Washington is warranted and would not result in a grave injustice.

IT IS ORDERED:

The Washington State Supreme Court does hereby reciprocate discipline in the State of Washington and therefore Jon Emmett Cushman is disbarred from the practice of law. Pursuant to ELC 13.2, the effective date of disbarment is seven days from the date of this order.
