Pursuant to Rule 13.5(a) of the Rules for Enforcement of Lawyer Conduct (ELC), a review committee of the Disciplinary Board issues the following admonition:

ADMISSION TO PRACTICE

1. At all times material to the complaint herein, you practiced law in the state of Washington.

FACTS

- On November 14, 2017, you appeared as counsel of record on behalf of plaintiff
 Michael Moi in the matter of *Moi v. Chihuly Studio, Inc., et al.*, Case No. 2:17-cv-00853
 (W.D.Wash.) (the "*Moi* Federal Court Action").
- On June 28, 2017, prior to your appearance in the *Moi* Federal Court Action, United States District Court Judge Lasnik ordered that certain factual allegations be redacted from Mr. Moi's pleadings.
- 4. On February 6, 2019, you, on behalf of Mr. Moi, caused materials to be filed in the *Moi* Federal Court Action in which you failed to redact the information at issue in Judge Lasnik's June 28, 2017 order.
- 5. On February 13, 2019, Judge Lasnik ordered you to, among other things, file redacted versions of the materials filed on February 6, 2019, and to "refrain from any further

public disclosures of the information	unless and	d until dis	sclosure	is authorize	d by the
Court"					

- 6. On February 18, 2019, you caused redacted versions of the materials at issue to be filed with the Court, consistent with Judge Lasnik's February 13, 2019 order.
- 7. On February 19, 2019, you filed a declaration in the *Moi* Federal Court Action arguing, among other things, that the information at issue was at all relevant times in the public domain.
- 8. On February 25, 2019, you, on behalf of Mr. Moi, caused materials to be publicly filed in the matter of *Moi v. Chihuly Studios, Inc., et al.*, Case No. 18-2-57768-3 SEA (King County Superior Ct.) (the "*Moi* State Court Action"), in which you failed to redact the information at issue in Judge Lasnik's February 13, 2019 order.
- 9. During a March 12, 2019 hearing in the *Moi* State Court Action, King County Superior Court Judge Messitt questioned the relevance of the unredacted information to the issues at bar.
- 10. On March 12, 2019, Judge Messitt issued an order sealing the information at issue, noting that the information was "not relevant to the merits of any motion before this Court...."
- 11. On June 20, 2019, Judge Lasnik issued an Order indicating the District Court's "clear disapproval of [your] actions..." and directing you "not to walk this path again."

MISCONDUCT

12. By willfully failing to comply with an order of the District Court for the Western District of Washington, you violated RPC 8.4(d) and RPC 8.4(j).

ADMONITION

YOU ARE HEREBY ADMONISHED FOR THIS MISCONDUCT. This admonition is not a disciplinary sanction, but is a disciplinary action, and shall be admissible in evidence in subsequent discipline or disability proceedings involving you.

You may protest the issuance of this Admonition by filing a written notice of protest with the Association-Attention: Clerk to the Disciplinary Board, within 30 days of the service of this Admonition upon you. Upon receipt of a timely protest, this Admonition shall be rescinded, and the grievance shall be deemed ordered to hearing.
